Streets

- Brush, Leaf and Yard Waste lookup dates
- <u>Winter alternate side parking rules</u>, November 15 to March 15

Budget

- Both Capital and Operating budgets before the floor next week
- Overview from wisconsin policy forum
- Highlights
 - City cost estimate increase \$110 annual tax (on \$410,000 value)
 - County and school districts will also provide their estimates

Metro bus

- Metro transit improvements and changes is part of cost
- East / West starting now, with other improvements
- North / South line, pending more funding, updates soon
- Issues at University Ave and East Campus mall

Funding for Housing

- Affordable Housing Trust Fund
- City gives money to developers

PFAS

- Well 15 on East Washington Ave, shut down in 2018
- \$5 million for remediation of well

Violence prevention

- Effort to prevent gun violence at 'struggling' complexes
- Often at newer places before community, connections establish
- Funding to support project passed

Traffic Engineering

- Proposal to get another in-house engineer to carry out planning, projects
- Private sector projects taking contractors

Cares Program

- Submitted proposal to get a Cares Team a vehicle
 - \$300k for three utility vans
- Three locations and have three vehicles, calls have gone up steeply
- They have the oldest vehicles in the city's fleet
- They are wanting vans to have consultations in the vehicles
- Two years of operation
 - <u>First year report</u>

Traffic Engineering

Meadowlark & Cottage Grove

• Request for traffic light at Meadowlark and Cottage Grove Road

- Scored highly at recent meeting
- Additional study and design needed, next review in January *Acewood & Cottage Grove*
 - Didn't make the cut, but is always in the study list
 - There's also a lot of pedestrians here, which I'm curious how that impacts

Onyx / Meadowlark & Acewood

- Lots of speeding on this stretch (recently a pet died)
- City does look at ancillary impacts of recent changes
- Other problems that arise in this way, sometimes get priority quicker

Harmony Apts

- Had town hall with partners, residents
- Discussing mismanagement and severe negligent issues
- Hoping to force property to do improvements with nuisance abatement
 - Nuisance threshold is three (3) issues in a 90 day term
 - Issues have to be related to how property is manage

Investigation

- Vehicle from shooting was found, abandoned
- No arrests, as of Tuesday

DISCUSSION

State of the association

- Many active members joined at the start of COVID (2020/21)
- We have had diminishing participation among community at large
- Some events have been productive though, thanks to Board participation
- Questions: How are we doing? What do we want to do?

Discussion

- Seth: I know that I could be doing more for a VP
- Robert: I know we could be doing more communications efforts
- We've done a decent job doing events we have committed to
- Events have gone well, when things line up
 - \circ $\;$ But we're also been just scrambling to get them done
- Other associations are also going through this too, diminishing participation
- We've established some connectivity with events and newsletters
- People that come to events are not ultimately coming to meetings
- When we do have public at meetings, their interests are to talk more about negative issues not not about community building

Maybe we should focus on when and where people want to show up
Slip in some meeting type things at those events, rather than meetings

Question: What are other neighborhoods doing?

- Marquette
 - Alternating board and public schedule
- <u>Elvehjem</u>
 - Monthly board meetings
 - \circ $\;$ Have issues forums and many events, recruit prominent speakers
- Grand View has good participation
 - Will likely become a HOA at some point, have dues
 - Twice a year public meetings, and get speakers
 - Have a newsletter that goes to 1400 homes

Planning Process

- Public planning effort in 2023 for Eastside, including Rolling Meadows area
- Other areas planning efforts go well when neighborhood infrastructure exists
- Could take advantage of this process and coordinating events in parallel
- City Planning Division, <u>Plans</u>
- Madison is very plan-oriented with development and have significant influence
- Derek will share more as it gets figured out

Meetings

- Katy: Doesn't seem worth our time to do public meetings that are solely meetings
- Pull back on every month meetings? Perhaps every other or quarterly?
- Just to public meetings and not Board only meetings?

Leadership

- We don't really have a pipeline of leadership or officers too
- Structured meetings and promotion could certainly help, but enough?
- Scrambling to hold the events we do have
- Need better project management for events we're planning
